

# Nemuro City Waste Sorting Chart

## Burnable waste (Charged red waste bag)

(Kitchen waste) (Clothing, blankets, etc.) (Wooden items, woodchips and timber) (Branches, leaves, grass and weed cuttings) (Leather goods)

(Rubber goods) (Soiled paper (disposable diapers, paper cups, used tissue paper, etc.)) (Plastic products (video tapes, floppy disks, buckets, etc.)) (non-recyclable waste)

Collection day: Every  and

- Cut long waste into less than 50cm length.
- Drain excess water from kitchen waste.
- Remove excrement from disposable diapers.

## Non-burnable waste (Charged blue waste bag)

(Small household electrical appliances) (Metal products, edged tools) (Glass, china) (Fluorescent lamps)

(Others (lighters, dry batteries, non-recyclable cans and bottles, etc.))

Collection day:  of the  and  week of every month

- Do not include kitchen waste.
- Carefully separate broken glass and sharp objects for collection staff, as they may be dangerous.
- Thoroughly remove gas from lighters.

## Bulky refuse (charged)

Collection day:  
The 10<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> of every month



- Large-sized home electronics and furniture that cannot be put into the designated bags (40 liters)
- ◆ For items that cannot fit inside the designated bags, put the sticker of 126 yen each.
  - ◆ Note: For all equipment (two plates and two sticks), four 126-yen stickers (904 yen) are required.
  - ◆ If the collection day falls on a Sunday or holiday, it will be collected on the following day.
  - ◆ Contact the Environmental Hygiene Section of the city hall to arrange collection until the morning the previous day.

## Recyclable waste (transparent or semi-transparent bags)

### Glass, bottles, etc.

◆ Bottles of juice, liquor, jam, seasoning, etc.

• Rinse off dirt with water.  
• Make sure to remove caps.

Collection day:  of the  week of every month

### Foam trays

◆ Foam polystyrene trays, food trays

• Rinse off dirt with water.  
• Remove labels and stickers.  
• White and colored trays can also be recycled.

### Paper

◆ Magazines/Catalogs

◆ Newspapers (including leaflets)

◆ Beverage containers displaying the mark shown on the left.

◆ Cardboard boxes

◆ Items displaying the paper containers and packaging identifying mark

[Paper boxes] [Paper cups]

[Other paper (paper bags, wrapping paper, etc.)]

◆ Other miscellaneous paper (Items whose size is bigger than that of a business card (80cm x 5.5cm))  
- Letters, envelopes, photos, postcards, etc.

◆ Directly put newspapers and magazines in bags without tying them up.  
• For cardboard boxes, cut them to fit bags.  
• Make sure to put papers into bags because soiled papers cannot be recycled.

## Empty cans

This mark is displayed.

◆ Beverage cans, alcohol cans, tin of food, spray cans except paint cans, etc.

### PET bottles

This mark is displayed.

◆ Beverage and seasoning bottles

Collection day:  of the  and  week of every month

① Rinse off dirt with water.  
② Do not crush.

• Remove gas from spray cans thoroughly.

Collection day:  of the  and  week of every month

① Remove caps.  
② Remove labels.  
③ Rinse off dirt with water.  
④ Do not crush.

• For caps and labels, refer to "plastic containers and packaging."

Collection day:  of the  and  week of every month

### Plastic containers and packaging

This mark is displayed.

[Cups and packs]

[Bottles and tubes]

[Plastic bags]

[Netting]

• Use up all contents of containers.  
• Rinse off dirt with water.  
• Drain the excess water and dry.  
• Do not put plastic containers in plastic bags for ease of sorting work.

**Make sure to remove dirt from recyclable waste.**

- ◆◆ Waste not collected and disposed by the City ◆◆
- Items specified in the Home Appliance Recycling Act (TVs, washing machines, refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners)
  - Items that manufacturers are responsible for collecting and recycling (PCs etc.)
  - Hazardous items (Toxic, infectious and explosive items)
  - Items that are difficult to be disposed of properly
